Executive Summary

The **Golden Knights Youth Football Organization (GK-YFO)** is a registered **501(c)(3) nonprofit** dedicated to providing a **premium, safety-first, and developmentally focused youth football experience** for children ages **4-14**, while intentionally removing the financial and access barriers that prevent many families from participating.

GK-YFO serves Cibolo and the surrounding San Antonio metro area through structured youth football programs that emphasize **discipline, leadership, confidence, and community pride**. Our teams span from 4U through 14U and follow a progressive development pathway supported by **USA Football-certified coaching**, age-appropriate instruction, and strong safety standards.

Local businesses and individual donors are essential to this mission. Your support allows us to:

- Provide **loaned, state-of-the-art safety equipment** so families are not required to purchase costly gear
- Deliver **certified, development-focused coaching** that builds confidence, resilience, and teamwork
- Host games at **SCUCISD facilities**, including district stadiums, elevating the athlete and family experience
- Sustain a multi-year growth model that increases participation while **reducing per-athlete costs over time**
- Ensure access for **military families, working families, and children from all backgrounds**, reinforcing equity and inclusion

This structure ensures accountability, compliance, safety oversight, and transparent management aligned with nonprofit best practices and IRS 1023-EZ requirements.

Market Analysis & Community Need

Cibolo is a rapidly growing suburban community with a high concentration of families and children. As growth accelerates, demand for **safe, structured youth programs** has increased significantly.

Youth football offers proven benefits—physical health, discipline, teamwork, and confidence—but participation is often limited by:

- Registration fees **(\$200-\$350 per child)**
- Required personal equipment purchases **(\$500-\$700 per child)**
- Facility and league costs

These barriers disproportionately impact families with multiple children, military-connected households, and families experiencing transitions.

The greater San Antonio region is one of the most military-connected areas in the country. Military families typically relocate every **two to three years**, creating disruptions in youth sports continuity. Programs that require large upfront costs or privately owned equipment often fail to accommodate these realities.

GK-YFO addresses this need by offering **loaned equipment, consistent safety standards, and flexible access**, ensuring stability and inclusion for both civilian and military families.

How the Golden Knights Program Impacts the Community

Affordable Access: Subsidized equipment and low registration costs reduce financial barriers for families in a median-income community.

Support for Military & Transient Families: Loaner gear, stable programming, and community integration offer vital continuity during frequent moves.



High Safety & Quality Standards: Modern protective gear, certified coaching, and facility partnerships build parental confidence and reduce injury risk.

Community Integration & Pride: Use of district stadiums and alignment with Steele High School's football culture gives youth a sense of belonging and regional identity.

Youth Development & Inclusion: By offering a structured, inclusive program, Golden Knights ensures children from diverse backgrounds – economic, military, or otherwise – have equal opportunity to grow, learn, and compete.

Community Giving & Donor Recognition

1. The Knights Shield Donor Club

A Community-Focused Giving Network Supporting Youth Opportunity

The **Knights Shield Donor Club** is a tiered giving program designed specifically for individuals and small local businesses who want to champion youth development in Cibola, Schertz, and the surrounding areas. Donor Club members provide flexible funding that directly supports:



- **Subsidized uniforms and equipment**
- **Athlete scholarship assistance** (“Sponsor-a-Player”)
- **Training and practice equipment replacement cycles**
- **Use of SCUCISD facilities**, including Steele HS and district stadiums
- **Safety initiatives**, such as helmet reconditioning and medical supplies

How the Knights Shield Donor Club Works

Donors select a tier aligned with their capacity to give. Every dollar directly enhances the athlete experience and improves program access for families facing financial challenges—particularly the high number of **military families** experiencing frequent PCS moves and financial instability.

Each tier corresponds to a tangible impact, making sponsorship personal and meaningful:

Knights Shield Club Donor Tiers		
Tier	Annual Contribution	Impact
Champion Knight	\$500–\$999	Helps fund equipment library (helmet, pads, reconditioning, and yearly helmet recertification)
Guardian Knight	\$250–\$499	Supports one athlete’s practice gear or contributes to stadium rental
Shield Knight	\$100–\$249	Subsidizes multiple athletes' uniforms and equipment
Community Knight	\$25–\$99	Provides essential items such as chin straps, practice equipment, footballs, and supplies
Knight Supporter	\$1–\$24	supports day-to-day program needs and athlete access

All donor tiers receive **recognition on the GK-YFO website** and **donor wall**, and Champion-level donors receive acknowledgment at home games.

2. Sponsor-a-Player Program (Individuals & Small Businesses)



Many families—especially those with multiple children or military parents—face financial barriers to youth football participation. The *Sponsor-a-Player* program ensures every child who wants to play, can.

Donor Options:

- **\$150 sponsorship** → **fully** supports one **flag** player's season
- **\$300 sponsorship** → **partially** supports one **tackle** player's season
- **\$450 sponsorship** → **fully** supports one **tackle** athlete's estimated annual cost

Each sponsorship includes:

- A personalized **thank-you letter**
- **Optional acknowledgment** (public or anonymous)
- A **certificate** signed by the athlete and coaching staff

3. Local Small Business Giving Opportunities

These contributions allow businesses to connect directly with local families while helping reduce operational costs.
